



## Castor Church of England Primary School

### Pupil Premium funding 2017-18

Each year the school receives Pupil Premium funding from the Government. This is a sum of money that is allocated to the school based on the number of children who are identified as 'disadvantaged children' or 'service children'.

Funding for these children in the academic year 2017/18 is as follows:

Disadvantaged children (incl. Ever6)	£1320 per child
Looked after children / Post looked after children	£1900 per child
Service children (incl. Ever6)	£300 per child

The purpose of this funding is to raise the progress and attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between these children and their peers.

#### Contextual information

Castor Church of England Primary School is a one-form entry school with a Pupil Admission Number (PAN) of 26 in each year group. In total, we have 178 children on roll, organised into 7 single age year group classes.

We have a relatively small number of children in receipt of Pupil Premium, and as such, the individual needs and characteristics of these children are quite different. It is important to note that of our 17 children eligible for the funding, 10 children are identified as 'disadvantaged' children and 7 are identified as 'service' children.

Summary of spending

This year, we have received £21600. The table below summarises how we have used our funding. At the end of the academic year, we will evaluate the impact it had on the academic outcomes for these children.

<b>Allocated Funding</b>	<b>How the funding has been spent.</b>
£8400	Afternoon intervention sessions led by Teaching Assistants. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium who are at risk of 'falling behind' will be targeted for these sessions.
£5479	Class based support from Teaching Assistants in Literacy and Numeracy for PP children in Reception to Year 5 throughout the year.
£645	1 x Teaching Assistant to lead Sensory circuits from 8:45am. This encourages children to be in school and on time, with an active start to their school day.
£1000	School trips incl. residential
£500	Uniform

£935	Curriculum- swimming, music
£3000	HLTA intervention support
£350	Staff development to introduce new Maths Scheme to improve progress and results
£430	Resources to support new working methods for Maths
£350	Staff development to introduce new Reading programme to improve progress and results
£200	Resources to support new working methods for Reading
£311	Family Learning sessions to support families.
